

Unit Price Options - 2026

Insured producers may select a Unit Price for each insurable crop. The unit price is used to determine the total value of the insured crop under the contract of insurance. In the event of a claim, the unit price is multiplied by any shortfall in production to determine the amount of the claim payable.
